Third Quarter 2023 Performance Review

Mr. Davidson reviewed the Third Quarter 2023 Performance Report and discussed general market and economic conditions. There is a somewhat similar pattern to last quarter, with surprising U.S. economic resilience in the face of ever-higher interest rates and increasing geo-political turmoil. The U.S. jobs market remained strong in September, adding a well over expected 336,000 jobs during the month. It cooled in October, but the unemployment rate remains low at 3.9%. In spite of any job market strength, the Federal Reserve appears to be comfortable with their progress on the inflation front and no additional interest rate hikes seem eminent. Hyas Group expects markets to continue to digest the unfolding interest rate and geopolitical situations and trade in a narrow range. The Third Quarter earnings cycle has concluded with not much appearing to unsettle markets. In this backdrop, both equity and fixed income markets sold off and the SERS Portfolio performed in line with expectations during the quarter. The portfolio was down 1.9% and the policy benchmark was down 2%. This leaves SERS with a 5.6% return year-to-date relative to the benchmark's 4.2%. The Private Credit and Real Estate categories were the biggest contributors to positive relative performance.

At quarter-end, there were three managers on watch for performance in violation of underlying policy benchmarks. The Hotchkis & Wiley High Yield Fund, Sterling Mid Cap Value Fund, and the Contrarian Emerging Markets Fund remain in violation of policy parameters and will remain on watch. Each of these options posted strong performance numbers relative to benchmarks during the quarter. SERS also held the MFS Large Growth Fund on qualitative watch as a result of the recently announced departure of one of the senior portfolio managers on the strategy. Hyas Group will look to hold this watch status, and revisit during the First Quarter of next year.

Hyas Group updated the Board on the approved transition for the BlackRock High Yield Bond Fund to the less expensive Commingled Investment Trust (CIT) vehicle. The Hyas Group analytics team continues to work with staff and the custodian on completing the necessary trust paperwork. We are expecting the change to take place during the first quarter of next year.

Hyas Group informed the Board of a recently received capital call for the Morrison Street Fund VII. Hyas Group will work with staff to raise the capital to satisfy this call.
